Bloom in the Desert Ministries (Bloom) is a United Church of Christ (UCC) that had Methodist

beginnings. This liberal Protestant church was born in 2002, as an independent ministry in collaboration with Methodist organizations seeking to start and promote inclusive Christian ministries. Sunday worship began on March 9, 2003. The fledgling congregation decided in 2004 to pursue standing in the UCC, which was established by vote of the Eastern Association of the Southern California Nevada Conference of the UCC on October 29, 2005, welcoming Bloom as a dual covenant, peace, and justice congregation. Bloom is a member of the UCC Open and Affirming Coalition and the Reconciling Ministries Network (Methodist). Bloom is governed congregationally according to our unique bylaws. All Bloom members and friends are ministers in our faith. Our Open Leadership Team and congregation meetings provide leadership and decision making to empower our vision, mission, and core values.



Today we celebrate 103 years of victory since women were finally granted the right to vote.

This legislation was introduced into Congress in 1878, but was not passed until August 18, 1920 being certified on August 26, 1920, changing the face of the American electorate forever.

The 19th Amendment guarantees all American women this right today. Although for our black and brown sisters, that right did not come true until 1965.

Militant suffragists used tactics such as parades, silent vigils and hunger strikes often meeting fierce resistance to obtain this goal.

Jesus empowers women and men with new life. Today we celebrate this new life for all women in America, and we specifically thank God for our sister suffragist leaders: Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Lucretia Mott, Susan B. Anthony, Emmeline Pankhurst and Frances Willard to name a few.

The Spirit is made manifest in us by the encouragement, strength, and empowerment we share as we continue the work of social justice in the Realm of God and as we recognize these and all leaders of this movement to give the equal right of voting to all women in these United States of America.

Genesis 45:1-158

Then Joseph was no longer able to hold back his feelings in front of his attendants, and he cried out to them, "Leave me!" So no one was present when Joseph made himself known to his brothers—but he wept so loudly that all of his Egyptian attendants heard him, and the news of it reached the Pharoah's palace. Joseph said to his brothers, "It is I —Joseph! Is my father really still alive?" The brothers could not answer, so dumbfounded were they.

Then Joseph said to the brothers, "Come closer to me." When they had come closer, he said to them, "I am your brother Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt! Please don't rebuke yourselves for having sold me here. God sent me here ahead of you so that I could save your lives. There has been famine in the land for two years, and for the next five years there will be no tilling and no harvesting. But God sent me ahead of you to guarantee that you will have descendants on earth and to keep you alive as a great body of survivors.

"So it was not you who sent me here, but God! God has made me Pharoah's chief counselor, the head of the household and governor of all Egypt. Hurry back to our father and give him this message from Joseph: 'God has made me governor of all Egypt. Come to me here at once! Do not delay. You will live here near me in the territory of Goshen, you your children, your grandchildren, your flocks, and herds, and all your possessions. I will provide for you here—for the next five years will be years of famine—so that you and your children and all that you own will be spared from destitution.'

"You can see for yourselves, and so can my brother Benjamin, that it is I who speak to you. Report to our father about how I am honored here in Egypt, and about everything you have seen. Go quickly, now, and bring my father to me!" Joseph threw his arms around Benjamin and wept, and Benjamin embraced him and wept too. Then he kissed his other brothers, weeping over them as well, and then he and his brothers talked.


