

On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood up and shouted,

"Any who are thirsty,

let them come to me and drink!

Those who believe in me, as the scripture says,

'From their innermost being will flow rivers of living water.""

Here Jesus was referring to the Spirit, which those who came to believe were to receive—though she had not yet been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.

Several people in the crowd who had heard the words of Jesus began to say, "This must be the prophet." But others were saying, "He's the Messiah." Still others said, "Surely the Messiah is not to come from Galilee? Doesn't scripture say that the Messiah, being of David's lineage, is to come from Bethlehem, the village where David lived?" So, the people were sharply divided over this. Some of them even wanted to arrest Jesus. However, no one laid hands on him.

The Temple guards went back to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why haven't you brought him in?"

"No one ever spoke like that before," the guards responded.

"So, you too have been taken in! the Pharisees replied "Do any of the Sanhedrin believe in him? Any of the Pharisees? The rabble knows nothing about the Law—and they are dammed anyway!"

One of their own, Nicodemus—the same person who had come to Jesus earlier—said to them, "Since when does our Law condemn anyone without first hearing the accused and knowing the facts?"

"Don't tell us you're a Galilean, too!" they taunted him. "Look it up. You'll see that no prophet comes from Galilee." (Inclusive Bible Version)

Here ends the reading of the Holy Gospel. This is the Good News of Jesus Christ

Thanks be to God. Amen.





May our future actions grow from here!



Bloom in the Desert Ministries (Bloom) is a United Church of Christ (UCC) that had Methodist

beginnings. This liberal Protestant church was born in 2002, as an independent ministry in collaboration with Methodist organizations seeking to start and promote inclusive Christian ministries. Sunday worship began on March 9, 2003. The fledgling congregation decided in 2004 to pursue standing in the UCC, which was established by vote of the Eastern Association of the Southern California Nevada Conference of the UCC on October 29, 2005, welcoming Bloom as a dual covenant, peace, and justice congregation. Bloom is a member of the UCC Open and Affirming Coalition and the Reconciling Ministries Network (Methodist). Bloom is governed congregationally according to our unique bylaws. All Bloom members and friends are ministers in our faith. Our Open Leadership Team and congregation meetings provide leadership and decision making to empower our vision, mission, and core values.
