

New Testament Reading

Romans 10:4-13

The Messiah, however, is the goal and fulfillment of the Law, [end of the law, NRSV] and everyone who has faith will be made righteous.

Moses writes about the righteousness that comes from the Law: "Those who do these things will live by them." But the righteousness that comes from faith says, "Don't say in your heart, 'Who will ascend to heaven?" —that is, to bring Christ down— "or 'Who will descend into the underworld?" —that is, to bring Christ up from the dead. But what does it say? "The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart.' This is the Word of faith. For if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Sovereign and believe in your heart that God raised Jesus from the dead, you will be saved. Faith in the heart leads to being put right with God, confession on the lips to our deliverance.

Scripture says, "No one who believes in God will be put to shame." Here there is no difference between Jew and Greek; all have the same Creator, rich in mercy toward those who call: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Most High will be saved."

* Gospel Matthew 23:1-15 Jim Nixon

Jesus told the crowds and the disciples, "The religious scholars and the Pharisees have succeeded Moses as teachers; therefore, perform every observance they tell you to. But don't follow their example; even they don't do what they say. They tie up heavy loads and lay them on others' shoulders, while they themselves will not lift a finger to help alleviate the burden.

"All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and wear huge tassels. They are fond of places of honor at banquets and the front seats in synagogues. They love respectful greetings in public and being called 'Rabbi.'

"But as for you, avoid the title 'Rabbi.' For you have only one Teacher, and you are all sisters and brothers. And don't call anyone on earth your 'Mother' or 'Father.' You have only one Parent—our loving God in heaven. Avoid being called leaders. You have only one leader—the Messiah.

"The greatest among you will be the one who serves the rest. Those who exalt themselves will be humbled, but those who humble themselves will be exalted.

"Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You shut the doors of heaven's kin-dom in peoples faces, neither entering yourselves, nor allowing others to enter who want to.

"Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You go on and on with prayer and show, all the while devouring the only security that widows have—their houses; you, therefore, will be given greater punishment.

"Woe to you religious scholars and Pharisees, you frauds! You travel over land and over sea to make a single convert, and once that person is converted, you create a proselyte twice as wicked as yourselves."

Bloom in the Desert (Bloom) is a United Church of Christ (UCC) that had Methodist beginnings. This liberal Protestant church was born in 2002, as an independent ministry in collaboration with Methodist organizations seeking to start and promote inclusive Christian ministries. Sunday worship began

on March 9, 2003. The fledgling congregation decided in 2004 to pursue standing in the UCC, which was established by vote of the Eastern Association of the Southern California Nevada Conference of the UCC on October 29, 2005, welcoming Bloom as a dual covenant, peace, and justice congregation. Bloom is a member of the UCC Open and Affirming Coalition. Bloom is governed congregationally according to our unique bylaws. All Bloom members and friends are ministers in our faith. Our Open Council Team and congregation meetings provide leadership and decision making to empower our vision, mission, and core values.
