Loving creator of all, sovereign of peace, receive now our heartfelt silent prayers.



Hebrew Scripture Reading

Proverbs 8:1-4,12, 22-31

Doesn't Wisdom cry out and Understanding shout? Atop the heights along the path, at the crossroads she takes her stand. By the gate before the city, at the entrances she shouts, "I cry out to you, people; my voice goes out to all of humanity."

I, Wisdom, dwell with prudence; I have found knowledge and discretion. The Lord created me at the beginning of his way, before his deeds long in the past. I was formed in ancient times, at the beginning, before the earth was. When there were no watery depths, I was brought forth, when there were no springs flowing with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I was brought forth; before God made the earth and the fields or the first of the dry land. I was there when he established the heavens, when he marked out the horizon on the deep sea, when he thickened the clouds above, when he secured the fountains of the deep, when he set a limit for the sea, so, the water couldn't go beyond his command, when he marked out the earth's foundations. I was beside him as a master of crafts. I was having fun, smiling before him all the time, frolicking with his inhabited earth and delighting in the human race.

But I have said these things to you so that when their time comes, you will remember that I told you about them. "I didn't say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. But now I go away to the one who sent me. None of you ask me, 'Where are you going?' Yet because I have said these things to you, you are filled with sorrow. I assure you that it is better for you that I go away. If I don't go away, the Companion won't come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. When he comes, he will show the world it was wrong about sin, righteousness, and judgment. He will show the world it was wrong about sin because they don't believe in me. He will show the world it was wrong about judgment because this world's ruler stands condemned.

"I have much more to say to you, but you can't handle it now. However, when the Spirit of Truth comes, he will guide you in all truth. He won't speak on his own, but will say whatever he hears and will proclaim to you what is to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and proclaim it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine. That's why I said that the Spirit takes what is mine and will proclaim it to you. Soon you won't be able to see me; soon after that, you will see me."

Here ends the reading of the Gospel. This is the Good News of Jesus Christ.





Rev. James Bowman Harris (Rev. James) earned his BA, Cum Laude in Biblical Studies with a dual major in Preaching Ministry from Point University in Georgia. In his senior year, he earned the Up-and-Coming Theologian Award given to the student with the highest GPA in the Biblical Studies degree program. He went on to earn a Master of Divinity from Emory University's Candler School of Theology.

Rev. James was ordained into the United Church of Christ (UCC) at his home church, Kirkwood United Church of Christ, Atlanta, GA. He has served on the Board of Directors in the Southeastern Conference of the UCC. He then became the settled Pastor of United Church of Cookeville UCC in Cookeville, TN and then at Pilgrim Faith UCC in Oak Lawn, IL.

After leaving Pilgrim Faith UCC, Rev. James returned to Florida to be closer to his family due to his mother's declining health. Upon returning, he strengthened his Pastoral Care and counseling skills while serving patients and families as a hospice Chaplain with Hope Healthcare in Fort Myers, FL and as a chaplain with Gulf Coast Medical Center. Rev. James is currently serving as a Hospice Chaplain and Bereavement Specialist with VITAS Healthcare in Wesley Chapel, FL. After serving for the past 5 years in chaplaincy, Rev. James began feeling God calling him back to serve as a pastor and is excited to return full time to serving a local church.



Bloom in the Desert (Bloom) is a United Church of Christ (UCC) that had Methodist beginnings. This liberal Protestant church was born in 2002, as an independent ministry in collaboration with Methodist organizations seeking to start and

promote inclusive Christian ministries. Sunday worship began on March 9, 2003. The fledgling congregation decided in 2004 to pursue standing in the UCC, which was established by vote of the Eastern Association of the Southern California Nevada Conference of the UCC on October 29, 2005, welcoming Bloom as a dual covenant, peace, and justice congregation. Bloom is a member of the UCC Open and Affirming Coalition. Bloom is governed congregationally according to our unique bylaws. All Bloom members and friends are ministers in our faith. Our Open Council Team and congregation meetings provide leadership and decision making to empower our vision, mission, and core values.
